GUIDELINES

 - b. PiA Mass meetings - at least once a term
4. Agenda of the meetings shall be notified to all members at least 1 week prior to the meeting.
5. Members entering school premises are required to sign in and out at the Guard House.
6. Members to wear red PiA T-shirt or plain red t-shirt for school events.
7. Members are to dress appropriately for physical meetings in school.

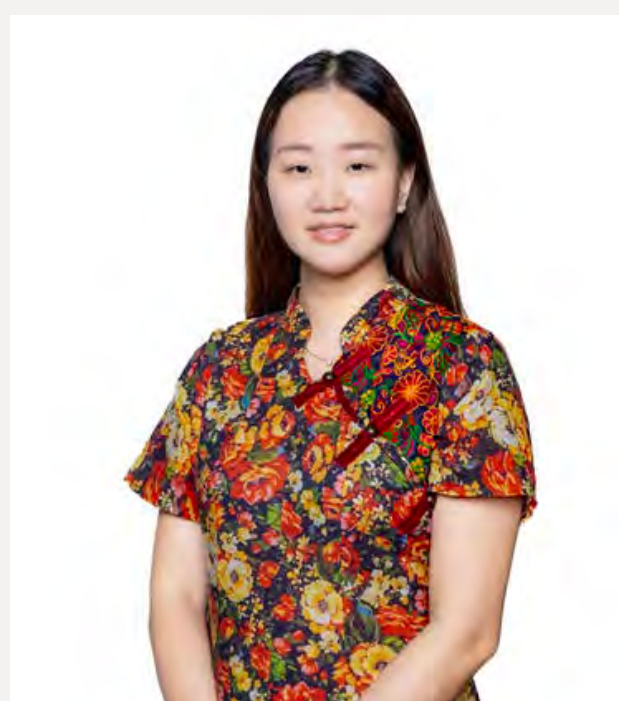

(CCA)

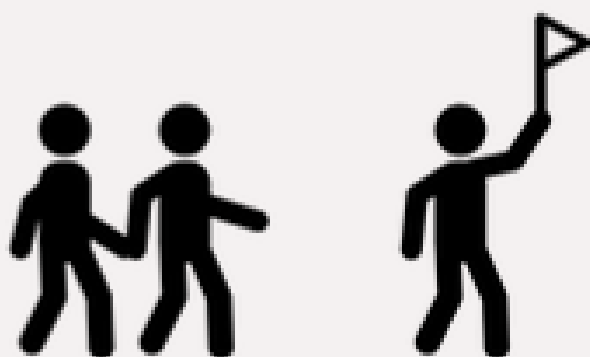
- Support teachers and pupils during CCA sessions to enhance the development of students' skills and aptitude

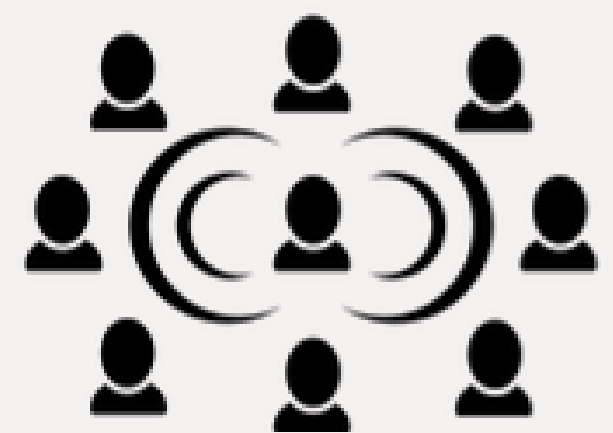
